

GALLERY 101

LAUNCHING OF NEW GALLERY

Gallery 101 began, in room one hundred and one, Rand Central Building, Johannesburg. The date was April 5, 1961. Today the gallery has, in the same building, two additional galleries, a shop on two levels (ground floor and basement) and a boutique facing the arcade. On the first floor the total space covered is 2,500 square feet.

The new gallery (on the first floor) will be opened by Professor Ernst van Heerden on February 10. The exhibition will comprise sculptures and paintings in the two large galleries and graphics, drawings and water-colours in the small gallery. The works shown will be the works of old masters and the latest paintings of South African artists. The list of artists and sculptors includes nearly every important artist in the country. To make a random selection there will be works by Kenneth Bakker, George Boys, Erik Laubscher, Douglas Portway, Joan Clare, Elsa Marschall, Maud Sumner, Ernest Ullmann, Rhona Stern, Nerine Desmond, Dirk Meerkotter, Judith Mason, Laurence Scully, Armando Baldinelli, Frank Spears and Jan Buys who was the first artist to show at this gallery.

Joyce Fourie has joined the staff of Gallery 101. The "Portrait of Joyce" is an early work by Maurice van Essche.
