displaying temerity in saying that his St Jerome in the Frick Collection—though I know it only by reproduction—and Maurice van Essche's Prophet may well be looked at together.

Maurice van Essche was born in Antwerp in 1906, and studied his art first in Brussels and later in Paris. He has worked under Matisse.
