
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Dumile at Sao Paulo

Dumile, the Bantu artist of Johannesburg whose turbulent drawings won him fame soon after he first wandered into a city gallery with some examples of his work, is in the news again.

Five of his drawings are in the South African exhibit at the Sao Paulo Biennale; one has been chosen for a catalogue illustration. His second one-man show has already opened in Johannesburg. His previous show was almost a sellout and last year he also exhibited successfully in Durban.

Dumile's work has been bought by several South African galleries and by collectors in the United States and Europe.
