Phases in a painter's career

EXHIBITION: Abramowitz (Gallery 101).

AN aura of the French postimpressionists hovers round the still-life painting of Pinchas Abramowitz, an artist-lecturer from Tel Aviv visiting Johannesburg for the second time in 10 years.

But these still-life—elegant, dignified and well designed—are only one facet of the painter's work on view, for he has travelled through several phases and given us a glance at each.

The transition from an earlier stage in which a limited range of dull, earthy tones were used, to some of the Oriental "landscapes" (or designs) in full-bodied, dazzling colour, is like an emergence from a twilit world into the blaze of day.

VITAL FACTOR

However, I think the most significant of this artist's "phases" is found in his large canvas, "Morning." Here, in a shimmering liquidity of blues, his experienced handling of the oil medium serves to express an emotion and becomes a vital factor in his work.

This exhibition gives one a strange sensation of "turning over the pages" in an artist's life and career.
