Andrew Murray is holding his fifth one-man show at the Dorp Street Studio, Cape Town, in June.

Murray, a 51-year-old Cape Town journalist, is a self-taught artist: he started painting at the age of 39. He paints in the evenings and at weekends at his home-formerly the studio of François Krige - above the gallery, which he runs jointly with his wife, Beryl Murray. His medium is mostly casein tempera.

Andrew Murray has had previous one-man exhibitions at Henri Lidchi Gallery, Cape Town (1963), Gallery Shear, Cape Town (1965), Grosvenor House Museum, Stellenbosch (1965), Gallery 101, Johannesburg (1966) and has taken part in many group shows.

He is represented in the book, S.A. Kuns / S.A. Art produced by the Rembrandt Art Foundation, which bought two of his works.


